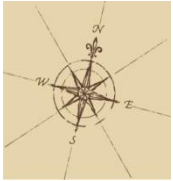

*The Tim Foster Scholarship is designed for students who have overcome significant obstacles in their lives and despite their individual hardships have accomplished or are in process of accomplishing their goals. This is a tribute to Tim's "Cowboy Up" philosophy and passion for helping "at risk" youth.*

*He had a passion to help people and spent the better part of his life giving his time to "at risk" students as their Principal, Teacher, and most importantly, their friend. He said every now and then one of these teens would get out of hand and he would "cowboy up" and show them how to take responsibility. He would tell many stories about putting his arm around a teenager who had gone astray in life and talking to them for hours. He gave them something that no one else would, a future.*

*There's an old saying that says, "The outside of a horse is good for the inside of a man". Tim used this philosophy when he started the SHILOH ride program that showed "at risk" students how to care for a horse. In doing so it gave them maturity and responsibility. Tim taught these kids to love and be loved simply by giving them his time.*
