## Permanent Speech & Interview Rotation Schedule San Joaquin County Academic Decathlon

The original list was established by random drawing at the Office of Education on December 16, 1998. Two secretaries--Dawn Dilley and Kim Langley--drew school names which were recorded by Dave Sorgent, Academic Decathlon Coordinator at the time. The intent of this drawing was to decree a **permanent** order in setting up the speech/interview schedule in the annual San Joaquin County Academic Decathlon Championship. Each year the number one team will move down to the bottom of the list so that no team is penalized by going first or last every year. The teams that move in/out of the competition each year were originally placed at the bottom of the list. A provision was also made for a new team (school). If a team does not participate in any given year, their slot remains the same. In this scenario, however, the coordinator will simply drop the team from the order; the order does not change. The next team will simply move up one slot. **Coaches are strongly encouraged to work vigorously to assemble a complete team of nine students (three A, B, C students) so that the rotation is not jeopardized by missing slots. Because of the schedule, teams will not be allowed to enter fewer than six students as a team. If a team cannot find a complete team of six students, the school will have to enter the students in the Alternates' Division.**
