## Ninth Grade Mathematics Placement Protocol one.Charter

In 2015 the California Legislature enacted SB 359, the California Mathematics Placement Act of 2015, which mandates that schools adopt a fair, objective and transparent mathematics placement policy for $9^{\text {th }}$ grade students. In compliance with SB 359 , one.Charter has developed the following placement protocol. For the full one.Charter Math Placement Policy please refer to our webpage or student handbook.

## INITIAL PLACEMENT

Ninth grade initial placement determination made in spring of eighth grade year:

- Geometry or Integrated Math 2- Student has completed Algebra I or Integrated Math 1 with a C or better.
- Integrated Math 1 (A/B)- Student meets 3 of the placement indicators.
- Integrated Math A- Student meets 2 of placement indicators.
- Integrated Math A with Math Fundamentals- Student meets 1 or less of the placement indicators.


## PLACEMENT VERIFICATION

Student placement will be reevaluated within 30 days of $9^{\text {th }}$ grade year

Initial Placement Indicators (Spring of $8^{\text {th }}$ Grade Year)

b. Integrated Math A: C in previous semester
c. Integrated Math A with Math Fundamentals: D or lower in previous semester
3. $7^{\text {th }}$ CAASPP Scores $/ 8^{\text {th }}$ CAASPP Scores
a. Integrated Math 1 (A/B): Scores with Meets or Exceeds Standards
b. Integrated Math A: Scores within Nearly Met Standards
c. Integrated Math A with Math Fundamentals: Scores within Standards Not Met
